These awards are named for Rose Fishkin who was a Cornell graduate, member of our branch and a believer in lifelong education for women. The six amazing young ladies were selected by their high school guidance departments as the top female graduating student in their class. They represent each of the high schools in the Freehold Regional School District.

This year's recipients are outstanding in terms of academic achievement, community involvement and leadership skills. They are:

Jessica Mena - Colts Neck HS

Jessica has participated in the All Shore Symphonic Band, The Marching Band, The Concert Band and the Jazz Band. She has been a member of the Rock-Climbing Team.
